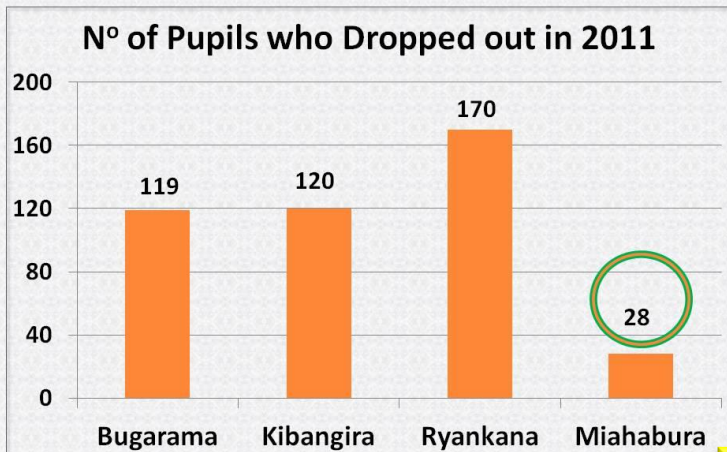

RSVP is a Scottish Charity dedicated to **enabling Bugarama children to change** their lives **through** education. In this edition, we report excellent 2013 National Test Results (Equivalent of UK's 11+) and our dream to replicate this success in other village schools.

Quantifiable Impact : National Test Results 2013 (11 Plus Equivalent) and Drop Out Rates 2011

Mihabura	5	7	10	13	15	12	6	19	26/51 (50.9%)	51 Mihabura School pupils sat the equivalent of 11+ exam in Oct 2013. 26 passed with high enough grades to get a place in the <u>very competitive</u> boarding secondary schools. That is 50.9%.

Indeed, with the exception of 2010/2011, since 2007, Mihabura Primary school, our partner, has had **the highest pass rate**.

Mihabura Primary School is **celebrated** as a non private school success story in the entire region: Our head teacher, Japhet Ndagijimana, was on air on 13 February 2013 to explain the secret behind this remarkable success. Also, schools are now sending their teaching staffs to Mihabura for "a day educational visits".

In 2007, RSVP started investing in Mihabura School with objective expectation that this would improve attendance rates, and, consequently, pupils' performance.

To further corroborate our retrospective statistical analysis spanning 2007 to 2009 (not shown), we can prove **Mihabura School also had the lowest drop out rate in 2011** (only 28 pupils).

Former Educational Minister's hard look at our evidence

Reverend Peter Dickson (*right*) from Trinity Church Aberdeen (previously at High Church Hilton) and I met Dr Charle Muligande (*middle*) to discuss our findings (low drop out rates and better performance). He simply said **"if he had the means, he would replicate our work in all Rwanda schools"**!

And since RSVP **spends 100% of donations on the ground** (no salaries, no office, no cars etc), **with only about 30K a year**, we are able to feed over 1000 pupils a day, monitor their attendance and performance, sponsor over 50 pupils for boarding school etc and **report quantifiable impact to our Donors!**

With **2 additional classrooms** in Mihabura from Jan 2014, and **possible further 5 classrooms in Jan 2016**, we can dare to expect even better performance in the future. **Our dream** is to cover all 5 village schools, starting with Ryankana. And approximately **£25K/year** is all we need for this. Only that!
