## Jean Main Program - Standing up against Childhood Malnutrition





What does this have to do with your Education mandate?

If not rescued in time, our school meals and porridge will be too little too late for these 3 months, 5 months, 6 months & 4 year olds.



How do you go about this?

- With <u>critical months known</u> & <u>worst affected areas</u> <u>mapped</u> to Bugarama & Muganza;
- With Bugarama health centre alone reporting <u>74</u> <u>cases of malnutrition</u> including 3 breastfeeding & 3 pregnant mothers;
- As little as £200/month would extend our existing SOSOMA porridge to such 74 unlucky babies and mothers.
- Revolving Door Malnutrition: According to doctors and nurses, there are two annual critical periods during which malnutrition cases rise. That is March to April and September to November.
- Selection: Positive identification of malnourished children will be based on weight. The assessment will be carried out by Islamic Health Centre through its Community Health Visitors. RSVP will hold a register showing child's name, parents, location, age and weight.
- Volume: A census carried out in December 2011 showed 30 children were SEVERELY malnourished. Last week, 18 children required 7 days inpatient admission for milk based diet locally known as F75. The government provides 2kg SOSOMA flour/week. But, there are doubts as to whether the sick child gets any of that.
- → Plan: Head nurse talks suggest 2 daily SOSOMA porridge centres. Children to be weighed weekly by Community Health Visitors to assess impact. Attendance to be checked against RSVP Register.
